

What is TIFL?




TEACHING ONLINE IS GREAT IF YOU'RE...

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WHAT DO I NEED?

Before you can start teaching English online, there are a few things you'll need to make sure you have. These include:

- A fluent level of English this means you'll need to be able to speak English at a native or near-native level
- An accredited TEFL qualification from a reputable course provider (like i-to-i!)
- A laptop/PC
- Strong internet connection
- Webcam
- Quiet area of your home to teach

If you've got all of these, congratulations - you're ready to start teaching English online!

Do I need to pass any exams to become an online teacher?

Reputable online TEFL employers will expect you to have completed a TEFL certification course. This will provide you with a solid grounding in teaching methodology and train you how to plan and deliver effective TEFL lessons.


TEFL courses are normally assessed through short knowledge tests, written assignments and/or observation of teaching practice rather than formal exams. A good TEFL course will be very practical. It will enable you to gain the skills you need to successfully gain your TEFL certification and be ready for your first TEFL job.

How much does it cost to train to be a TEFL teacher?

TEFL training doesn't need to break the bank. Prices vary considerably, based on the level of course, whether you want to study online or in a classroom environment and who is delivering the course. If you're happy to study online, you can find a good quality, regulated Level 3 TEFL certification course for as little as R2,000. At the other end of the scale, a classroom-based CELTA course could set you back around R30,000.

If you choose to get your TEFL qualification with i-to-i, you can rest assured that your qualification will be <u>accredited and regulated by the UK Government</u>, <u>approved by the US government</u> (through DEAC), and recognised and respected by employers from around the world.

FOR DEGREE HOLDERS

Company name	Requirements
Learntalk	- No experience needed - Bachelor's Degree in any subject - No minimum hours required
Alter	- No experience needed - BA Degree or a Teaching Diploma or have at least 2 years of a degree completed, in any subject - Minimum 10 hours per week required
iTutorGroup	- 1+ years experience required - Bachelor's Degree in any subject - Minimum 10 hours per week required








FREELANCING ONLINE

Once you're qualified, you'll have the option of teaching for a company, or becoming a freelancer and working for yourself!

Online tutors can either be their own boss, decide their own hours, set their own rates of pay and advertise to find their own students on freelance teaching websites. Or, you can apply for work with a language school and they'll do all the hard work for you.

The only downside to working for a language schoool is that you'd have your rates set for you - and sometimes, your working hours too. Your decision's never set in stone, so if you decide you want to freelance, you can always change your mind and work for a language school instead and vice versa.
