## FREELANCING ONLINE:

### The requirements

Your online freelancing options will depend on the qualification you have, but this is good news as it means you're in complete control!

#### Applying with a company

If you're applying to a company, most require you to be a native English speaker and have a globally recognised TEFL/ TESOL/CELTA qualification. Some require a degree, but this depends on the country where the company is based. Usually the degree is a requirement for visas, but by choosing to teach online, you won't need a visa so you'll have lots of options.

#### Experience

A lot of companies provide in house training, so if you're just starting out on your freelance journey, don't worry! Each company operates differently and uses different teaching methods, this means they're usually less worried about experience and more interested in that all important TEFL qualification.

#### Technical requirements

A well-lit and quiet room/area is one of the main teaching online requirements. Make sure you have somewhere you aren't going to be interrupted or has excessive background noise. A lot of teachers use noisecancelling headphones as well when teaching, so this is a good item to add to your 'freelancer' shopping list'. Along with a quiet space, headphones, and a webcam the key to being a successful online freelancer - high quality internet! A lot of companies will ask you to run a 'speed test' before starting or as part of the application process to ensure your internet speed is high enough to meet their requirements and you can teach without internet problems. Pro-tip: You can test your internet using www.speedtest. net. If your internet is above 10mbs you're good to go!

## FREELANCING FOR ONLINE COMPANIES


A lot of the TEFL companies enable you to work for them, but as a freelancer - result. This means you aren't tied in to one particular company, so depending where you are in the world and where your students are, you might be able to teach across multiple platforms and make the most of different time zones. For example, if you're UK based and teaching for Palfish, your mornings through till lunchtime/early afternoon will likely be full, but then you'll still have afternoon and evening availability for students based across the UK & Europe. Some companies might want you to sign a contract, however this is usually to confirm you agree to their terms and conditions etc and not that you are tied into them exclusively.

» Pro tip: Make sure you read the small print thoroughly in your paperwork to ensure you're allowed to work for multiple companies before signing your contract!





## INTRO & DEMO VIDEOS




#### Intro videos

A short 2-3 minutes self-recorded video where you are required to introduce yourself to your future employer. It's important to showcase your qualifications, skills, and even your personality throughout your intro video. Make it fun, eyecatching, and informative to stand out from the crowd!

#### » Pro tip: be energetic, confident, and speak clearly

#### Demo videos

Demo videos often come in the form of a mock lesson. These can be with a genuine student, an interviewer pretending to be a student or a prerecorded lesson. You'll get all of the information you need from your employer to hold a successful lesson, all you need to do is give yourself time to prepare and you'll smash it!

When it comes to freelancing as an online TEFL tutor, the key to success is knowing how to succesfully market yourself, your services, and your skills to potential future students!

## CREATING YOUR OWN WEBSITE

Setting up your own website isn't a necessity but it's definitely a good idea if you're looking to build a long-term TEFL career.

Here you can share your qualifications, lesson plan ideas, pricing structures and offers, blogs, and of course your teaching style, so students can see what to expect from you. It's also a secure way for students to contact you and pay for lessons up front, as well as starting to gather a database of potential students who sign up to your site.

To create your own website, you can either use free online tools to create it yourself, or pay a freelancer to create a website for you.

#### Creating a website

Creating a website can be a fun and rewarding experience, but it can be quite tricky if you don't have the skills already. If you think you're up to the task we'd recommend using a website building tool to help you on your way.

## MARKET YOURSELF ON SOCIAL MEDIA!

Advertising on social media is the quickest and easiest way to share your freelance business online. Different platforms work for different teachers depending on your target audience. From Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn and even TikTok - each platform has a different audience that can all be used to share your teaching wisdom and draw attention to your teaching skills and availability!

Most of these platforms enable you to setup a business account separate to your personal social media which means you can concentrate on targeting the right audience with your content. Twitter, Instagram, and LinkedIn are the best at attracting a wider/worldwide audience by using a range of different hashtags to attract potential students who may not already be following you.

Sharing information such as your daily routine, about you, and your teaching style is a great way to start on social media so potential students can see what you are like as a person and teacher. You can also use these platforms to share English language tips as well as any offers or promotions you might have on.

## ONLINE MARKETPLACES FOR ADVERTISING




### START A TEACHING BLOG

A great way for potential students and fellow teachers to learn more about you is blogging. Whether you blog for your own website or for other websites, you can share your blogs via all your social media platforms and on your website. This is a great way to share content and increase your online presence. And the great thing is, you can blog about anything!

Again, similar advice to sharing content on social media – don't overdo it! Blogging once a week/twice a month is great, readers can learn about you as a person and teacher and can look forward to reading your next blog without feeling overwhelmed – and most importantly, you won't use up all your good blog ideas too quickly!

## ONLINE MARKETING CAMPAIGNS

If you want to boost your online presence across different platforms, there are lots of options to help with this and spread your freelance journey to a global audience - Google ad campaigns, Facebook ad campaigns and sponsored posts on Instagram are a great place to start. The best campaign for you to use will depend on your goal and target audience.

Be careful not to set your spend too high on your first go, start small and build up so you can review traffic and see if the campaign is working as you'd expected. If you go ahead and set up a website, you can also set up an email campaign sharing your teaching message to everyone who signs up to your site - another great way to reach potential students.

> » Pro tip: Facebook ad campaigns can be the most cost effective way to build brand awareness. Simply create an eye-catching image, add some enticing copy and a link

through to your website!



## SETTING UP YOUR BUSINESS

Whilst being a freelancer has numerous pros; being your own boss and choosing your own hours for starters, you'll also have to put your responsible hat on. First things first, it's important you register your business online, or register as self employed with your local or national tax office (HMRC for example - https://www.gov.uk/set-up-self-employed). Being a freelancer means you're responsible for filing your own taxes at the end of each tax year, so make sure you keep a record of all your invoices, payments & remittances, and especially all those receipts for work related purchases as you can put these against your income. There's usually an easy step by step guide to follow online so don't panic!


#### **Business banking**

Once you've set up your own business, you can also look at setting up a separate, or business bank account, however sometimes business accounts come with extra charges, so it's always best to check out the options first and see if it's the right fit for you. If you choose to use your normal banking, just make sure you keep in organised.






#### Microsoft Teams

#### Which one's best?

Each video conferencing software has its own benefits, and you might prefer using one over another, however, always check what works best with your student first. Some online companies will use platforms such as Zoom or Skype, but others will have their own app or secure teaching platform set up for teaching. Companies providing their own apps or teaching platforms will provide training and often a demo lesson in advance so you can be confident when it comes to your first lesson.

## TYPES OF LESSONS

Students want a variety of lessons/lesson content depending on their requirements, and again you can have some control over this if teaching your own students. You can decide what you want to teach based on your experience, goals, and qualifications. It's a great idea to have an introductory lesson with your student to find out their learning needs and goals so you can plan lesson content accordingly. Most students simply want to practice their English, so you'll often find coversational English lessons are your most popular. But, if you opt for a more specific type of lesson you can often earn more!



### LESSON PLANNING

After deciding which type of lesson you're going to teach, you then need to plan your lesson. There are lots of different resources that you can use online if you're new to teaching, as well as planning your own lessons from scratch. Depending who

you're teaching, the topic and length of lesson will all impact your planning. Make sure to allow time in between classes for lesson planning and preparation.

If your target teaching audience are children, then props and flashcards will be absolutely essential within your online lessons. You can easily make your own props and flashcards if you're the creative type. If not, you can find lots of props online that you can use as templates or buy ready-made props if you want to save time.

For teens/adults sometimes props are needed, but in this case you can use realia - so real life items to help explain new vocabulary that the students can easily understand. For realia you can use items you already have around your home. For example, if you're teaching a lesson about food, you can use the food you have on hand.

Along with props for children, fun backgrounds are also needed - animals, alphabet letters, colours and numbers are all great things you can make/print/buy to stick on your wall. By creating an interesting and fun background, your young students are more likely to stay engaged with your lesson.

## MANAGING YOUR TIME AND SCHEDULE


One of the most important skills of being a freelancer is managing your time! Make sure you have a good diary or organiser with all your classes, training, and prep time booked in. If you have an online planner, make sure it's backed up to a cloud storage system just in case! It's really easy to get a few bookings close together and then realise you're double booked.

As well as managing teaching time, and making sure you have enough planning time, it's also important to make sure you have time for you. Easier said than done at the start of your freelance career, as you want to accept every student that comes your way. But you need to make sure you're always 100% for each student, which means making time for you. Depending on the hours you want to work, try and keep one day a week free for teaching down time (and probably some life admin)!



## TOP TIPS & TRICKS

to being a successful freelancer



Keep hydrated & energized: make sure to always have a drink on hand, especially if your day is filled with back to back lessons! And a pot of snacks is always a good idea for a little sugar boost when needed.

Get a good diary/planner: whether it's an old fashioned written one or an online one just make sure you have a backup.

Respond quickly: reply quickly to emails from companies and potential students. There's a high demand out there and companies want to know you're interested in teaching positions. If you leave it too long, your potential student may have already moved on to the next tutor.

Use earphones/headphones: headphones are great for improving sound quality and keeping out background noise during lessons.



Keep a notebook and pen with you at all times: one of the key things all TEFL teachers should have on hand during lessons - note down any requests from students, anything they're struggling with or any ideas that you think of during class.

Attend CPD and online training: there are lots of webinars and CPD training available online to make sure you're always up to date with the latest news and information in the online TEFL world.

Join online teacher groups: Facebook teacher groups are a great place to share ideas and get help with any teaching queries and share teaching successes.

> Follow online TEFL teachers: there are so many teachers online across all the social media platforms, and all are really happy to help fellow freelancers with all aspects of teaching, so don't be afraid to reach out. It's a great online community and support bubble.




