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

PLANNING A LESSON

COURSE ASSESSMENT

 The end-of-course test: this is a multiple-choice quiz with 58 questions based on the course material and you'll need to achieve 75% or above to pass.
 Lesson plan: we'll give you a choice of scenarios and age groups to base your lesson plan on. You'll just need to fill in the lesson plan template and submit it to your tutor for grading.

3. Essay: you'll need to write 1,000-1,500 words to explain the thinking behind your lesson plan. This will also be submitted to your tutor for grading.

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
WHAT'S MY ROLE?

There are 2 main types of teaching positions in Japan – public schools and private language centres (known as Eikaiwas) - and your role will be slightly different, depending on where you complete your placement. In the Eikaiwas you will get more autonomy and independence. You'll have more flexibility on classroom topics, and you'll be physically opening and setting up classrooms and closing them up for the day so you're really in charge! You will also probably need to commute to multiple locations, so your contact hours will be shorter. In public school placements, you'll be an assistant teacher, working alongside a lead Japanese classroom teacher. Your role will vary as you will have the opportunity to lead the class sometimes, with guidance from the Japanese teacher, and at other times you will be assisting and providing one-on-one support to students. Your primary function will be to help with conversational and spoken English in this type of placement.

Your role as a TEFL Teacher consists of:


- Teaching students through engaging English lessons
- Creating lesson plans, resources, and marking
- Conversing with the students in . English
- 20 30 hours of teaching per week . (with 2 days off)
- Becoming everyone's favourite new teacher!





Let's talk money!

You'll be earning a salary of US\$1650 - \$2300 (£1300 - £1,800) per month and receive a stipend or reimbursement for work-related transport. What you do with your salary is, obviously, completely up to you but we know we'd be spending ours eating amazing sushi and ramen, riding the famous bullet trains, and seeing incredible Kabuki shows!

What's not included:

FLIGHTS - Prices will vary depending on where you're flying from. We recommend checking out Skyscanner for bargain flight deals!

VISA - Usually around US\$25 - \$50

POLICE CHECK - Costs vary from country to country, but expect to pay around US\$30 - \$70

UTILITY BILLS - Costs will vary depending on usage, but utilities typically cost US\$55 - \$90 per month

 ${\bf RENT}$ - This will vary depending on where you live, but estimated monthly cost is US\$350 - \$650 per month

HEALTH INSURANCE - Around US\$20 - \$40 per month

TRAVEL INSURANCE - Prices can vary, make sure you shop around and have this in place before you travel

OTHER COSTS - US\$20 a day should cover all your food, laundry, and transport needs (remember you get work-related transport costs reimbursed!) If you're working in a public school you'll also need to budget around US\$140 a month for rental car costs.



EVERYDAY ESSENTIALS

Restaurant meal – 1000 JPY¥ (£6 / US\$7) Bottle of local beer – 550 JPY¥ (£3 / US\$4) Metro ride – 210 – 310 JPY¥ in Nagoya (£1 / US\$2)



HOW MANY HOURS WILL I BE TEACHING EACH WEEK?

You'll be teaching around 20-30 hours a week, with 2 days off.



WHAT TYPE OF SCHOOL WILL I BE TEACHING AT?

There are two main types of schools that we place people in – private language schools (Eikaiwas) and public schools. The placement you get will depend on when you want to start (Eikaiwas hire throughout the year, public schools tend to hire in March and September).

CAN I GET A DISCOUNT IF I'VE ALREADY TAKEN A TEFL COURSE?

HOW MANY STUDENTSWILL BE IN MY CLASS?

Class sizes vary between public schools and language schools. Public school classes tend to have around 20-30 students per class, whereas language schools are smaller – they usually only have 6-10 students per class.



• WILL THERE BE ANY OTHER TEFL TEACHERS AT MY SCHOOL?

It's not common for TEFL teachers to be placed at the same school but don't worry! You'll have plenty of time to get to know the other TEFL teachers on the internship during your online orientation course and in-country cultural weekend, so you'll have a strong support network.

• WILL I NEED TRAVEL INSURANCE?

> Yes! Wherever you're from, you will need to book travel insurance and make sure it covers you for the full duration of the role.



• WHAT WILL MY • ACCOMMODATION BE LIKE?

Our internship partners will help you to find suitable and affordable accommodation. Most apartments in Japan are single occupancy and fairly basic but comfortable. It will contain all the essentials you need and will be a commutable distance to your school.
